Give thanks in all things, because we believe that God will work for good in everything we experience.

I have been wondering about a lot of things these last 8 months as we entered this new experience of what it means to be church. The Covid 19 Pandemic as meant we could not gather physically as we have in the past. That challenges many of our most treasured understandings and experiences of what it means to be faithful followers of Christ, as well as what it means to worship God. We have accepted that the Christian faith is both an individual one, and a faith expressed corporately, with others. We have accepted the understanding that wherever two or three are gathered in Christ's name, there Jesus will be. We delight in singing in our worship, both lament and praise. Yet, if I sing alone, am I heard.

These months have been a challenge for us. We have continued to hold to some of the core understanding that make Ewing-Covenant who it is. Among these are that we will not exclude anyone from our worship. That has meant that we have not rushed to gather again, because that would have meant excluding people due to age, physical condition, and fear. We have continued to worship on a weekly basis, moving to a platform for worship that allows anyone to be present whether they use a computer or a phone. Music has continued to be an important part of our worshipping identity as the gifted among us have recorded and shared their wonderful talents. Our Care Team and Parish Leader Ministries have continued to connect the people of our congregation, sharing prayer, good news and concerns in an ever-increasing circle of care. And those who have been able have continued to gather and deliver food and other things with people of our community.

I do give thanks in the midst of these times that we are learning anew what it means to be faithful "followers of the way". Yes, it is challenging, and we have all needed to learn new ways of doing things. But I think God is at work refining us for the ministry and witness that lies ahead.
