What have you learned about being a witness to the love of God in Christ through the refining challenges of these days?

We have a challenge before us, friends. The challenge is to claim a future that is formed by God from and through the opportunities that our current life presents. In the midst of these times, how will we witness to the presence of God in our lives? How will we offer praise to God? How will we show and share God's love with those around us?

We have had more than 70 responses that will inform the work of the Return to Church Committee. That Committee will share a draft report with the Session next week, lining out what the sequence of steps for returning will be once it is safer for us to gather in small groups and for larger gatherings for worship. That time is not yet as the number and rate of virus infections is again growing in Mercer County.

The work of renovating office space for Pastor Ann is underway, and hopefully it will be ready for her when she is ready to return to working from her church study. We are also moving forward with the painting of the entryway of Fellowship Hall, and the foyer of our Worship Space. The work of replacing the chair lift in Fellowship Hall, and the wowrk on the porch of our Office Building still awaits the permits need to continue that project.

The important ministry of caring for those in our community continues. We just purchased and IPad for a Head Start family that will allow their preschool child to participate in the program. Carol and Mike, and others continue to transport and distribute the food gathered for the Easter Service Workers Association, and Pastor's Ann and Paul continue to minister to families beyond our congregation as they grieve the deaths of loved ones.

Our Care Team members, and the Elders and Deacons continue their crucial work of connecting with and caring for the people who consider the Ewing-Covenant congregation their church home. Theirs is a powerful ministry that has grown even strong in the time of Pandemic.

And we continue to come together for worship. There are ways that our on-line worship has strengthened the ties that hold us together, making even more real the awareness of the Spirit that joins us in faith, no matter the distance. Be sure to join our All-Saints Sunday worship on

November 1st as we celebrate the lives of all those of our church who have died since All-Saints Day 2019.
