I am sitting in my church study writing this the day after election day. I am reflecting on how deeply divided we are as a nation, as a people. I am aware that that sense of division reaches into the life of this congregation. I am also aware that at the heart of the gospel of Jesus Christ is the affirmation that nothing can separate us from the love of God, nothing, not even our own failings.

I am also conscious that from that affirmation of God's love comes a call and a challenge for you, for me, for all people of faith, and for all children of God (that means everyone). That call is to be reconciled to one another, and to live into a life that shares among all people the gifts of justice, mercy, peace, and love. Yes, those are ideals. But each one of those words carries deep implications for how we treat one another, how we treat those who disagree with us, how we care for the other in our midst. They are not concepts for some end of time theology, but are living actions we do to reveal the Kingdom of God already present in this world.

It may be days before we know the final results of the election. But, we do not need to wait to decide how we will live in response to whatever those results are. I shall continue, in all I do, continue to seek justice for all God's people, to do so with kindness and mercy, all while walking humbly with God.

On this day, I will leave you with some words from Martin Luther King, Jr.

But the end is reconciliation; the end is redemption; the end is the creation of the beloved community. It is this type of spirit and this type of love that can transform opposers into friends. It is this type of understanding goodwill that will transform the deep gloom of the old age into the exuberant gladness of the new age.
