"Enough"

Years ago, I heard a sermon which has really stuck with me. At that time, the church I belonged to was in the midst of a capital campaign. I don't recall the scripture the preacher used as her sermon text that day, but I do recall her saying this: "If you decide not to give to this church campaign, then at least give a financial gift to something or someone as you deem fit. Just give." Her words struck me as rather self-defeating at the time because her goal was to exhort us to financial generosity towards the church and its campaign for funds. As it turned out, her message was very impactful because the church project was one hundred percent financed, and then some!

During this month of February, as a church we enter further into a discussion about decision making with regard to stewardship. What is on my mind these days is the question of "enough". What is enough? Sometimes stewardship is discussed as tithing one tenth of your income. This is an interesting idea and a good rule of thumb in most ordinary circumstances. But what about this year, at a time when we are nearly 12 months into a pandemic and experiencing a "slow rollout" of a vaccine for Covid19? What, pray-tell, is "enough" to give to our church in a time such as this? Afterall, the national and world economies have been greatly impacted and it is still unclear what is to come. The need of communities for financial donations is staggering and reflects the depth of suffering which is experienced now in our country. And each of us have a unique circumstance and perspective from which we discern our giving to the church. What will the year hold for us? Will our savings be enough to tide us over if need be? Do we just scrape by paycheck to paycheck? Do we still have a job?

For weeks now, I have been pondering generosity.... what is it that motivates us to be generous? I can say that for myself, it is two main factors in addition to means. One is that I have to feel a passion towards what I am giving to. The other is that I have to be grateful in order to give. That is how I know it is the right thing for me to do! Of course, if you are like me, you are already very committed to the church, and pouring yourselves out, day after day, for the sake of the Gospel. This is a profound generosity which is achievable by all of us. But a level of financial generosity will, of course, vary among us. And it may be that this year, some of us will be able to give more, and there are those of us who will necessarily give less than we otherwise would have.

Whatever your circumstance, find something which you are grateful for. Whether you are able to give to the church or not...just give... to something or someone.



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

"Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms." 1 Peter 4:10

Over the last several Sundays, we have been examining stewardship as loving God with our whole being. Stewardship is how we "love God with all of our heart, soul, strength and mind" and "our neighbors as ourselves." As faithful stewards of God's grace, we are to love God and one another with every gift we have received for the well-being and good of everyone. Each Sunday our Stewardship Witnesses have spoken to how this has been lived out in their lives.

As our season of Epiphany draws to a close, we reflect upon how the light of Christ, our Messiah, has revealed God's reconciling love to us, and to all creation. The Light of the World continues to illumine our path as we respond to God's love by loving God and all people by following Jesus' example of restoring relationships and valuing each person as a child of God. And Jesus has assured us that the *Spirit of God will be with us* as we seek to do God's will.

An Update Regarding Three Program Offerings

Because of the ongoing circumstances of covid19, two of our programs—the monthly lunch group and our quarterly ROAM events—will now be offered on-line via zoom. A third offering is a new grief group which meets weekly. Here is more detail regarding these three programs:

The former Senior Lunch (Ewing) and Lunch Bunch (Covenant) becomes "Lunch Together...from Home" and takes place on the 3rd Thursday of each month. Mark your calendars: the first-ever "Lunch Together ...from Home" happens Thursday February 18th starting at 11:45. I look forward to seeing all of you; I extend a warm invitation to new persons who may be able to attend, too. The routine will be the same: gathering, conversation, a joke or two from Buzz Dakin, saying Grace, breaking bread together, and group sharing before we end. Participation is via Zoom by phone call in or by video (such as an iPad, laptop computer or other device). And yes, you will need to prepare a lunch for yourself to enjoy at home. Find the "Lunch Together...from Home" zoom link, meeting ID number, and necessary call- in information in the listings below.

ROAM (Regional Older Adult Ministry) will resume quarterly events via zoom. You may recall that **ROAM** began as a collaborative effort of Covenant, Ewing Presbyterian, and Historic "First" Presbyterian Churches, as well as ECHO, Inc. Back then, ROAM's programming was carried out by a working group which encouraged collegiality among pastors, and nurtured emergent leaders. Each ROAM event, designed for older adults' unique spiritual and practical concerns/needs, provided an in-person experience of fun, care, enrichment, growth, and community. Usually, a hot meal was served.

Although on-line programming will undoubtably change ROAM events, our hope is to continue ROAM's knack for finding the nexus where community-building, the arts, and spirituality all come together. Ideas are currently being vetted! In terms of meal, possibilities include sharing a special recipe so that we can all partake of something special, or perhaps a lunchbox may be dropped by your home for you to enjoy during the event. If you have ideas for making these events special, please let me know. *Meanwhile, keep an eye out for more information which will be coming soon!*

Finally, a grief group will begin this month for persons who have experienced the death of a loved one, either during the pandemic or earlier. It is now accepted that Covid19 challenges one's capacity as well as opportunity to process grief as one might otherwise do under more normal circumstances. Rituals surrounding grieving have been adversely impacted by Covid19, and isolation imposed by the virus has heightened loneliness felt by those who are bereaved. We will explore Christian traditions around grieving while we gently converse and faithfully walk together through our contemporary experience of loss, grief, and healing. 
