Dear Congregation Members and Friends,

As I write this, I am filled with joyful anticipation but also must ask for help.

In a very difficult time of pandemic, our Sunday worship service was "broadcast" via zoom, and effectively shouldered by Pastor Paul (who now moves into retirement), Carol Houghton and Natalie Houghton (who will resign at the conclusion of August) and myself. Paul broadcast from the worship space, with Carol, Natalie and myself participating from remote locations.

Just a month ago, on June 20th, we reopened our doors for in-person worship (maintaining safety protocols set forth by the reopening team and adopted by our church Session). Things shifted to now offer "hybrid" worship service (that is in-person combined with zoom), which is quite a challenge. Please know that there are two companies which have submitted bids and proposed plans to help us meet this challenge, and a new team is now forming to review their recommendations and set the path going forward.

In the meantime, your understanding patience are needed because we are just getting back on our feet; deacons are resuming tasks and duties. I realize there is dissatisfaction for some because what works well "in person" and what works well "on zoom" are very different animals, especially when it comes to sound quality. Understanding and patience because the status of the Covid19 virus is ever-changing and our reopening committee and session are continually assessing how worship happens safely.

I ask for your **help** because hybrid worship requires Carol Houghton and I return to traditional roles during worship. We also will begin using a new computer recently upgraded with necessary software. **Help is where you come in**: we need persons to serve as tech assistants. Please contact Pam Miller or Carol Houghton-- both on the worship team—or me if you are willing to do this.

And remember, God is surely with and for us. Let's be kind and patient with and for each other.

Pastor Paul's Covenant of Closure

In the Presbyterian Church (USA), part of the process of ending a pastorate is for the Pastor, the Session and the Presbytery to sign a covenant, or agreement about the departing pastor's involvement with the congregation in the future.

This Covenant of Closure is written to remind the pastor and the congregation of the importance of the departing pastor to "step out of the picture" so that the next pastor is able to connect with and develop pastoral relationships in the congregation. In my work as an interim and transitional pastor I have had to overcome the difficulties that are created when a former pastor makes him/herself

available to former parishioners at many of those key moments that provide the context for developing the new relationships. It is natural for you to want the comfort of that dearly beloved past pastor at the time of a hospitalization or death but know that the new pastor will be able to provide that just as effectively for you.

You all already know Pastor Ann, and that will be an asset over the coming year as you need the care and services of your pastor. I am confident that you will turn to her in your times of need.

Below you will find the Covenant of Closure that I have made with your Session and the Presbytery. I encourage you to read it. You will find in the Covenant the rationale for having it, and the and what I promise to do. You will read that the covenant allows the many friendships that have developed to continue. But the role of pastor to you has now ended. I look forward to my retirement. And I look forward to friendships that will live on in new ways.

A Covenant of Closure Between The Reverend Paul L. Rhebergen, the Ewing-Covenant Presbyterian Church, and the Presbytery of Central New Jersey

In recognition of the dissolution of the pastoral relationship between the Rev. Paul L. Rhebergen, the Ewing-Covenant Presbyterian Church, and the Presbytery of Central New Jersey this covenant of closure is formed, effective August 1, 2021.

The covenant is established in order that the way may be clear for the next pastor, temporary or installed, to fully develop the deep and significant relationships with the congregation and the community it serves without the unintentional interference of the former pastor. The covenant recognizes the importance of providing for the transfer of the pastoral leadership fully to the next pastor. The importance of this transition in pastoral leadership transcends any need the former pastor may have and the grief and discomfort of members of the congregation that comes with the change in pastoral presence and leadership.

With this Covenant of Closure, the Rev. Paul Rhebergen acknowledges that his role as Transitional Pastor to the Ewing-Covenant congregation has ended. Therefore:

- •He will not involve himself in any pastoral or leadership role in the life of the congregation.
- •He will not intervene, support, give advice or opinion regarding the dynamics or business of the congregation.
- •He will refer requests for pastoral services made by members and friends of the congregation to the pastor of the Ewing-Covenant Church and communicate the referral to that pastor.
- •He will not officiate in any special events in the lives of former parishioners or of the congregation, including weddings, funerals, baptisms, or any special congregational events, no matter where they may be held, unless expressly invited by the Moderator of the Session.
- •He will limit participation in social media, now or in the future, with the congregation. Communication will be confined to friendships. The covenants made for in person relationships shall apply to social media in all platforms.
- •He will not use church email, contact lists, mailing lists to disseminate information regarding events, programs, and groups that he will be leading or participating in. He may provide such information for any future moderator/pastor to share with the congregation as that person may wish.
- •He will not include members of the Ewing-Covenant in online studies, discussion, or chat groups that he personally initiates.
- •He will make himself available to the succeeding pastors/moderators at their initiative to assist in any ways that are mutually seen to be appropriate.
- •He will continue to pray for the congregation and its pastor as they continue to develop their mutual ministry.

This Covenant of Closure does not affect or require the termination of friendships with individuals in the Ewing-Covenant congregation, but does impact the interactions as in any way related to the congregation and its pastor.

With this Covenant of Closure, the Session acknowledges that the Rev. Paul Rhebergen's

relationship as Moderator and as Transitional Pastor has ended. Therefore:

- •The Session and its members commit to working with and supporting the ministry of the Rev. Ann Schoonover as the Moderator and Transitional Pastor of the Ewing-Covenant:
- •The Session and its members will encourage the congregation to pray for the ministry of the congregation as it lives into new pastoral leadership, and its full support of the pastor in her ministry.
- •The Session and its membership will share in the interpretation of the terms of this Covenant of Closure with the congregation and record this Covenant in the minutes of the Session.

The Committee on Ministry of the Central New Jersey Presbytery shall:

- •Interpret this Covenant of Closure to the Session and congregation of the Ewing-Covenant Presbyterian Church;
- •Note the Covenant in the Committee on Ministry minutes; and
- •Support Rev. Rhebergen and Rev. Schoonover in the living into this agreement.

The burden of responsibility for ensuring a healthy transition lies primarily with the professional behavior of the pastor who is departing. This transition demands empathy and maturity from all parties—the former pastor, the new pastor, the Session, the members of the congregation, and the representatives of the Presbytery.

All affirm that this covenant establishes the new relationship between the congregation and the retiring pastor. The policy does not expire with the passage of time but remains in effect in spirit even if the pastor is permitted to renew regular ties with the congregation.

We affirm this Covenant of Closure representing the cessation of our pastoral relationship. We give thanks to God for our time as pastor and congregation and now affirm our trust in the provisions of our Lord for our respective but separate futures.

RETURN TO CHURCH COMMITTEE

Sunday Morning Guidelines

We welcome you as you enter for worship this morning. As you enter, we ask the following of you:

- 1. If you have not already done so, please fill out a "Hold Harmless" form. Remember that you only need to do this once.
- 2. Fill out the Health Form for the day. This helps us know who is present so that we will be able to track who was in attendance should it become necessary for any health-related reason.
- 3. We ask that you remain masked until you leave the worship service and are again outside.

WHY DO WE ASK THAT YOU CONTINUE TO WEAR A MASK?

First, know that the Return to Church Committee and the Session are continually examining our protocols and procedures related to the COVID Pandemic. We realize that the State of New jersey has eliminated almost all restrictions for those who are vaccinated and recommends social distancing and masking for those not vaccinated be continued. Yet, the Pandemic continues to be with us, and the new variants of the disease is heavily striking the unvaccinated. And, while the effectiveness of the vaccine is incredibly high, it is still possible for a vaccinated person to contract Covid while suffering symptoms at a less dangerous level.

While the percentage of our congregation who have been vaccinated is high, we also know that there are those in our midst who are not able to be vaccinated for any number of reasons, including choice. We are an open congregation, welcoming any and all who come to gather with us in worship. We ask that all who attend our worship in person remain masked in order to respect and protect everyone, from the youngest child who cannot be vaccinated, to the oldest person who has been vaccinated but is still vulnerable to the Covid virus. It is for "the least of these" in our midst that we will continue to ask people to wear their mask during in-person worship.

We recognize that masking is difficult for some. If your mask becomes unbearable, we encourage you to step out of the worship service (yes, even during the sermon) and remove your mask once you have passed to the outside.
