- -Find out "what's up" with the Vision Team! Continuing to "put flesh on the bone" of our new vision and mission statement, and mindful of the input during two retreats so far, the team identifies three strategic priorities: (1) strengthening engagement of the congregation to serve each other and the broader community (2) improving communication (both internal and external communication) and (3) creating a more

RETURN TO CHURCH COMMITTEE

Sunday Morning Guidelines

We welcome you as you enter for worship this morning. As you enter, we ask the following of you:

- 1. If you have not already done so, please fill out a "Hold Harmless" form. Remember that you only need to do this once. *
- 2. Fill out the Health Form for the day. This helps us know who is present so that we will be able to track who was in attendance should it

become necessary for any health-related reason.*

- 3. We ask that you remain masked until you leave the worship service and are again outside.
- * For your convenience, an updated <u>COVID Screening</u> <u>Questionnaire</u> is now available on the church website.

WHY DO WE ASK THAT YOU CONTINUE TO WEAR A MASK?

First, know that the Return to Church Committee and the Session are continually examining our protocols and procedures related to the COVID Pandemic. We realize that the State of New jersey has eliminated almost all restrictions for those who are vaccinated and recommends social distancing and masking for those not vaccinated be continued. Yet, the Pandemic continues to be with us, and the new variants of the disease is heavily striking the unvaccinated. And, while the effectiveness of the vaccine is incredibly high, it is still possible for a vaccinated person to contract Covid while suffering symptoms at a less dangerous level.

While the percentage of our congregation who have been vaccinated is high, we also know that there are those in our midst who are not able to be vaccinated for any number of reasons, including choice. We are an open congregation, welcoming any and all who come to gather with us in worship. We ask that all who attend our worship in person remain masked in order to respect and protect everyone, from the youngest child who cannot be vaccinated, to the oldest person who has been vaccinated but is still vulnerable to the Covid virus. It is for "the least of these" in our midst that we will continue to ask people to wear their mask during in-person worship.

We recognize that masking is difficult for some. If your mask becomes unbearable, we encourage you to step out of the worship service (yes, even during the sermon) and remove your mask once you have passed to the outside.

Two months hence, we are at step #28, and just on the cusp of footfall onto step #29. (Of course, there is some need to revisit earlier steps briefly in response to some unanticipated surprises! No big deal, we are a resilient and determined bunch.)

The work now, at this point in time, is to roll up our sleeves and document: how does our church work? and listen: what are you the congregation saying to us?

Once that is accomplished, the vision team will write a report to the Session...for its approval. . .and then the COM (at the Presbytery level) reads and responds....and then I will ask the nominating committee to find "a diverse and representative group of people willing to serve as the PNC (Pastor Nominating Committee).

And that, my friends, will eventually put us just past step #33 on this road with a total 64 steps! Keep walking the walk! You are doing great!!! I will continue to let you know where we are

LET'S ALL MEET AT THE FARM!

On Wednesday, October 20 at 1:00 pm, Seminarian Rosa Ross and Jane Kidder are inviting you to join



us for a fun afternoon at Howell Living History Farm. You will be given a group tour, can meet the animals (sheep, chickens, horses, pigs, cow and the farm cat and puppy. You can learn about the history of the farm, the farm's mission to teach about farming as it was in the early 1900's and compare it with farming today and about the farm's efforts to supply food to local food pantries. The tour will be geared to your questions and interests.

You might even get to pet a horse or gather an egg. There is a golf cart available for up to 5 people and it's not a difficult walk for those who wish to enjoy some exercise. The trip is limited to the first 15 people who sign up with either Jane or Rosa and the cost is \$10 a person. You can either meet at the farm at 12:45 that day or form a carpool from church,


