While we gather with family and friends to celebrating a Thanksgiving meal this month, it is our church tradition to provide for meals for others in our wider community. In our worship together, we celebrate "All Saints" on November 7th, when we are joined by Rev. Larissa Kwong-Abazio. Thereafter our focus on Mark's gospel begins to shift: Sunday November 21st is our "Christ the King" service. On Sunday November 28th the liturgical season of Advent begins-- a time of waiting for the birth of the Christ-child. Again, this year, we lift up traditions of Advent as best we can, with a Cantata and other special worship services continuing, albeit using video and by zoom. Our Advent practice of waiting is rich; one particular way of embracing waiting is to open ourselves to (re)new faith and deepen community. In that regard, Adult Ed invites you to take part in its Advent series, offered by hybrid on Sundays following worship. Please contact Pam Hoffman or Sandra Austin with any questions.

In our congregational life, our church has begun its process of nominating persons to fill vacancies in the Session and serve as Deacons, as well as nominating members for the congregational nominating committee of 2022. (Please speak asap to Carol Taylor, Isaac Mungra, John Damrau, Carol Houghton or myself if you are willing to serve.) This important process requires we gather for a congregational meeting --which will be held on Sunday November 21st --to vote on nominees. Please mark your calendars now! Also, that day, Mission Sewing holds its sale to benefit Dr. Katie Wolf's "Friends for Health in Haiti" organization, a long-standing mission partnership of ours. Sylvia Allen and Jane Kidder can answer any questions.

Finally, keeping with themes of harvest and thanksgiving, I encourage each of you to acknowledge the blessings you have known despite this pandemic, and look with eyes of faith to see the blessings of God upon our church. While it is tempting to see only what is missing— such as the normalcy of unrestricted life without wearing masks, etc. -- our call to discipleship compels us to live abundantly knowing the gift of the Gospel, always proclaiming the Good News. Is there a blessing you've overlooked? What unexpected blessing are you are thankful for? How is God blessing you in this very moment? What good news shall you proclaim to yourself and also to your neighbor?

#### RETURN TO CHURCH COMMITTEE

#### **Sunday Morning Guidelines**

We welcome you as you enter for worship this morning. As you enter, we ask the following of you:

- 1. If you have not already done so, please fill out a "Hold Harmless" form. Remember that you only need to do this once. \*
- 2. Fill out the Health Form for the day. This helps us know who is present so that we will be able to track who was in attendance should it become necessary for any health-related reason.\*
- 3. We ask that you remain masked until you leave the worship service and are again outside.
- \* For your convenience, an updated <u>COVID Screening</u> <u>Questionnaire</u> is now available on the church website.

## WHY DO WE ASK THAT YOU CONTINUE TO WEAR A MASK?

First, know that the Return to Church Committee and the Session are continually examining our protocols and procedures related to the COVID Pandemic. We realize that the State of New jersey has eliminated almost all restrictions for those who are vaccinated and recommends social distancing and masking for those not vaccinated be continued. Yet, the Pandemic continues to be with us, and the new variants of the disease is heavily striking the unvaccinated. And, while the effectiveness of the vaccine is incredibly high, it is still possible for a vaccinated person to contract Covid while suffering symptoms at a less dangerous level.

While the percentage of our congregation who have been vaccinated is high, we also know that there are those in our midst who are not able to be vaccinated for any number of reasons, including choice. We are an open congregation, welcoming any and all who come to gather with us in worship. We ask that all who attend our worship in person remain masked in order to respect and protect everyone, from the youngest child who cannot be vaccinated, to the oldest person who has been vaccinated but is still vulnerable to the Covid virus. It is for "the least of these" in our midst that we will continue to ask people to wear their mask during in-person worship.

We recognize that masking is difficult for some. If your mask becomes unbearable, we encourage you to step out of the worship service (yes, even during the sermon) and remove your mask once you have passed to the outside.

Consider this: We live in polarized times where many curate their communities (particularly on social media) to include only those who share their politics, religion, or favorite sports teams. A person can even choose what news channels to watch for information that is interpreted to confirm what they already believe. Family holiday dinners are infamous for devolving into arguments where people talk past one another and forget why they are at the same table in the first place. How do we navigate this uphill climb to form a more authentic community with the people around us?

Let's explore together how we can follow Jesus by cultivating a life that bridges differences within our families, our congregation, our community, and ultimately the world. Stay after worship for four (4) sessions on this topic, including biblical examples, questions to expand your thinking, and intriguing discussion.
