# **Quake Reveals Day of Jesus' Crucifixion**

Jesus, as described in the New Testament, was most likely crucified on Friday April 3, 33 A.D.

The latest investigation, reported in the journal International Geology Review, focused on earthquake activity at the Dead Sea, located 13 miles from Jerusalem. The Gospel of Matthew, Chapter 27, mentions that an earthquake coincided with the crucifixion:

"And when Jesus had cried out again in a loud voice, he gave up his spirit. At that moment the curtain of the temple was torn in two from top to bottom. The earth shook, the rocks split and the tombs broke open."

To analyze earthquake activity in the region, geologist Jefferson Williams of Supersonic Geophysical and colleagues Markus Schwab and Achim Brauer of the German Research Center for Geosciences studied three cores from the beach of the Ein Gedi Spa adjacent to the Dead Sea.

Varves, which are annual layers of deposition in the sediments, reveal that at least two major earthquakes affected the core: a widespread earthquake in 31 B.C. and an early first century seismic event that happened sometime between 26 A.D. and 36 A.D.

The latter period occurred during "the years when Pontius Pilate was procurator of Judea and when the earthquake of the Gospel of Matthew is historically constrained," Williams said.

"The day and date of the crucifixion (Good Friday) are known with a fair degree of precision," he said. But the year has been in question.

In terms of textual clues to the date of the crucifixion, Williams quoted a Nature paper authored by Colin Humphreys and Graeme Waddington. Williams summarized their work as follows:

- All four gospels and Tacitus in Annals (XV,44) agree that the crucifixion occurred when Pontius Pilate was procurator of Judea from 26-36 AD.
- All four gospels say the crucifixion occurred on a Friday.
- All four gospels agree that Jesus died a few hours before the beginning of the Jewish Sabbath (nightfall on a Friday).
- The synoptic gospels (Matthew, Mark, and Luke) indicate that Jesus died before nightfall on the 14th day of Nisan; right before the start of the Passover meal.
- John's gospel differs from the synoptics; apparently indicating that Jesus died before nightfall on the 15th day of Nisan.

When data about the Jewish calendar and astronomical calculations are factored in, a handful of possible dates result, with Friday April 3, 33 A.D. being the best match, according to the researchers.

In terms of the earthquake data alone, Williams and his team acknowledge that the seismic activity associated with the crucifixion could refer to "an earthquake that occurred sometime before or after the crucifixion and was in effect 'borrowed' by the author of the Gospel of Matthew, and a local earthquake between 26 and 36 A.D. that was sufficiently energetic to deform the sediments of Ein Gedi but not energetic enough to produce a still extant and extra-biblical historical record."

"If the last possibility is true, this would mean that the report of an earthquake in the Gospel of Matthew is a type of allegory," they write.

Williams is studying yet another possible natural happening associated with the crucifixion - darkness. Three of the four canonical gospels report darkness from noon to 3 PM after the crucifixion. Such darkness

could have been caused by a dust storm, he believes. Williams is investigating if there are dust storm deposits in the sediments coincident with the early first century Jerusalem region earthquake.

# **Visioning Team Update - April**

The main goal now is to finish the Mission Study so that it can be submitted to Session for review. Once a final version is approved, the Mission Study will then be submitted to the Committee on Ministry at the Coastlands Presbytery.

We are excited to announce "... that at their March 16 meeting, the Session approved Ewing Covenant Presbyterian Church (without the hyphen) as the official name of our blended churches."

The Visioning Team has been editing the various categories of the Mission Study into a more cohesive narrative, working toward the final draft which will be discussed at a Zoom meeting with our moderator, David Redman, on April 20.

The Visioning Team spent the past month editing and combining text to finish the Mission Study in a more cohesive format. A Zoom meeting was held in March to discuss the logistics of how to combine, edit and streamline text for the 20 categories. Visioning Team members are writing Mission Study sections into narrative; reviewing each other's rewrite, and submitting comments to create a finalized draft which we'll discuss at a Zoom meeting with our moderator, David Redman, on April 11.

As always, we want to present a description of the congregation and its vision for the future of our church that represents the thoughts and feelings of our congregation to potential applicants for the position of Installed Pastor.




Bruce Wentworth at the Blessings Box.

## RETURN TO CHURCH COMMITTEE

**Sunday Morning Guidelines** We welcome you as you enter for worship this morning. As you enter, we ask the following of you:

- 1. If you have not already done so, please fill out a "Hold Harmless" form. Remember that you only need to do this once. \*
- 2. Fill out the Health Form for the day. This helps us know who is present so that we will be able to track who was in attendance should it become necessary for any health-related reason. \*
- 3. We ask that you remain masked until you leave the worship service and are again outside.
- \* For your convenience, an updated <u>COVID Screening</u> Questionnaire is now available on the church website.

#### WHY DO WE ASK THAT YOU CONTINUE TO

WEAR A MASK? First, know that the Return to Church Committee and the Session are continually examining our protocols and procedures related to the COVID Pandemic. We realize that the State of New Jersey has eliminated almost all restrictions for those who are vaccinated and recommends social distancing and masking for those not vaccinated be continued. Yet, the Pandemic continues to be with us, and the new variants of the disease are heavily striking the unvaccinated. And, while the effectiveness of the vaccine is incredibly high, it is still possible for a vaccinated person to contract Covid while suffering symptoms at a less dangerous level.

While the percentage of our congregation who have been vaccinated is high, we also know that there are those in our midst who are not able to be vaccinated for any number of reasons, including choice. We are an open congregation, welcoming any and all who come to gather with us in worship. We ask that all who attend our worship in person remain masked in order to respect and protect everyone, from the youngest child who cannot be vaccinated, to the oldest person who has been vaccinated but is still vulnerable to the Covid virus. It is for "the least of these" in our midst that we will continue to ask people to wear their mask during in-person worship. On March 16<sup>th</sup>, the Session voted to continue wearing masks during worship and while in the church office, and they request that you follow the CDC guidelines of wearing a KN95 or a surgical mask for everyone's protection.

We recognize that masking is difficult for some. If your mask becomes unbearable, we encourage you to step out of the worship service (yes, even during the sermon) and remove your mask once you have passed to the outside.
