

Jesus said, "Forgive One Another."



Beginning in the month of November, the adult education class will begin a new 4-week study called **Forgive**. As we move toward the season of Advent during which we prepare ourselves to celebrate the birth of the Christ Child, it is appropriate to examine the things that separate us from God and from others.

We forgive because God first forgives us. When we forgive one another, we participate in God's way of being in the world. At its root, the word *forgiveness* draws on a Greek word meaning "to let go." When we forgive one another, we let go of anger over wrong; we let go of a desire for getting even; we let go of the burdens of shame and guilt. To forgive is not to forget; it is an active decision to not live in the past and to build toward a future. Forgiveness does not deny the realities of sin: betrayal, violence, anger, jealousy. It ensures that wrongs do not have the last word. The final word in forgiveness is God's grace, available to those who seek to forgive and to move beyond separation and brokenness toward restored relationship with God and one another. Adult Reflection Guides will be available for participants. Join us immediately after worship!

Hearing Impaired Devices


If you wish to use a hearing-impaired device during service, please ask the greeters. Devices are compatible with earbuds and headsets if you wish to bring your own.
