Preachers for the Month of June

6/4/2023	Rev. Jenny Lee	Rev. JyungIn "Jenny" Lee has served Presbyterian Women in the PC(USA) as Moderator (2018-2021) and is the founder and the Director of Women Together, Inc, a non-profit organization for faith formation, empowerment, and leadership development for women. Jenny also is one of the founding organizers of the West Windsor Religious Leaders group, an interfaith group in West Windsor, NJ, and has served as its facilitator. She currently serves as a member of the Board of Directors of Womanspace, Inc. in Mercer County, NJ and as a member of the Synod of the Northeast Discernment Team. Jenny is a graduate of Princeton Theological Seminary and a member of the Presbytery of Coastlands.
6/11/2023	Rev. Dr. Byron Shafer	An emeritus professor of Biblical Studies at Fordham University and Pastor emeritus of the Rutgers Presbyterian Church in New York City. He served on the committee that edited our denomination's A Brief Statement of Faith. In retirement, Dr. Shafer was for 4 semesters Visiting Professor of Biblical Studies at United Theological College in Bangalore, India. He now serves on the Commission on Preparation for Ministry of our Presbytery of the Coastlands.
6/18/2023	Tori Paquette	Tori Paquette is a third-year Master of Divinity student at Princeton Theological Seminary, and has their B.A. in Jewish Studies from Colby College. Tori is passionate about small congregations, Hebrew, and economic justice. They hope to help mainline congregations strengthen relationships with their communities, particularly across lines of social class and religion.
6/25/2023	Mark Van Bruggen	Mark lives in New Egypt, NJ with Lisa, his wife of 31 years. Mark and Lisa are the parents of two daughters (Emily & Krista) and have one granddaughter (Karaleigh). Mark was raised in the Presbyterian Church. His father, Rev. Dr. Vernon Van Bruggen, is a retired Presbyterian minister and served for 18 years as the Executive Presbyter for the Presbytery of New Brunswick. From 1978 through 1991, Mark regularly worshipped at Covenant Presbyterian Church. After he and his wife married (July 1991 at Covenant Presbyterian Church), they sought a church home and joined the Methodist Church where he remains a member to this day.
