### **Introducing Reverend Morgan Valencia King**

It is with great pleasure and excitement we introduce Morgan Valencia King who was unanimously voted in as the next pastor of Ewing Covenant Presbyterian Church at a Congregational Meeting held on Sunday, June 25th.

Morgan is a 2014 graduate of Rhodes College in Memphis, Tennessee where he majored in religious studies. He received his Master of Divinity degree from Princeton Theological Seminary in 2018. Upon graduation, Morgan was hired as the Director of Engagement at Fifth Avenue Presbyterian Church in NYC, where he had been serving as a seminary intern. In November, 2021, Morgan was ordained and hired as an Interim Pastor at Lafayette Avenue Presbyterian Church in Brooklyn, NY. During his time there, the congregation has grown in membership and has taken on new



initiatives. Morgan states that one great drawback to being an interim pastor is that he does not get to see these new initiatives come to full fruition.

Morgan is an inspiring preacher. He is moved by the Holy Spirit, and he is able to relate the scripture to the issues of the world and the congregation. His leadership approach is collaborative, and he enjoys being "a companion for the journey" while working with staff, the congregation and church committees to advance the work of a "Matthew 25" church in the community.

When asked what attracted him to ECPC, Morgan stated that he is very impressed with our Mission Statement and Mission Study and the ways he sees us striving to live into our vision. Morgan is excited to be part of that vision and to start a long-term partnership with us. During his time as a student in Princeton, he came to love the central NJ area; he and his husband Jorge are looking forward to making this their home.
