

A topic of discussion will be: **the Vitality of a church is determined by the power of its Message. What is OUR message at ECPC? How do we attract (AND keep) a new generation of "Faith Seekers?"** We look forward to hearing your ideas!

Adult Education—Beginning in October-- Do Justice



"What does the Lord require of you but to do justice, to love kindness and to walk humbly with your God?" (Micah 6:8)

Join us through the month of October as we explore what it means to "Do Justice." We'll meet after worship on October 1, 15, 22, and 29.

Most humans are born with an innate, general sense of right and wrong. Young children can give a detailed explanation of justice through the eyes of the victim when they feel they have been wronged. In the *Do Justice* unit, we learn that we are not always correct in our assessments, but the desire for fairness in the world around us is deeply held. Being human means, in part, experiencing the frustration and anger of injustice, and the sense of restoration and wholeness that comes with justice served.

Through this practice, participants will find that Scripture is filled with the themes of liberating justice in ways that are bold and ways that are subtle, always returning to the need to bridge the gap between the world as it is and the world toward which God calls us. So that we may *do justice* in our lives, this practice explores seeing injustice, checking our own prejudice, speaking up, and doing the work that justice requires.

Peace & Global Witness Offering

The month of October is *Peacemaking* month. On October 1st (Worldwide Communion Sunday) we will be collecting the Peace & Global Witness Offering. There will be an envelope in your bulletin, as well as your offering envelope box and on the table in the worship space. The offering will be collected throughout the month if you are not available on October

1st. Please donate your offering to the church itself, meaning do not mail it into the Special Offering office.

Where does this offering go? What is it for?

A gift to the Peace & Global Witness Offering enables the church to promote the Peace of Christ by addressing systems of conflict and injustice across the world. Individual congregations are encouraged to utilize up to 25% of this Offering to connect with the global witness of Christ's peace. Mid-councils retain an additional 25% for ministries of peace and reconciliation. The remaining 50% is used by the Presbyterian Mission Agency to advocate for peace and justice in cultures of violence, including our own, through collaborative projects of education and Christian witness.

Presbyterian Women

The group will hold their regular monthly meeting in the Lower Lounge at 6:30 that evening. Instead of a study, everyone wishing to participate should bring a wrapped gift worth no more than \$10. This gift can be either something nice (a treat) or a gag (a trick) or a combination of the two. Everyone wishing to participate will contribute \$8 for the chance to pick a package. All proceeds will go to support the mission giving of PW. There will also be refreshments and devotions. All are welcome, so come join us for fun and fellowship.
