

Dear Friends,

Almost one year ago exactly in worship on Epiphany Sunday, I moved my hand over the glittery, angular pieces of cardboard I'd placed on the Communion Table the day before, not peaking to see what was written on the other side, until I finally settled on one to take home. The word written on the back, which I'll keep to myself (for now!) became my "Star Word" for 2023.

A fairly interpretive exercise based on the journey of the Wise Men who followed the light of a star to Jesus, Star Words is a meditative practice to reflect, pray and consider the wisdom behind a particular word or concept. A Star Word can be anything from peace or celebration to restraint or even self-discipline. The hope is that in spending time with your Star Word, whatever it may be, it will lead you at least a bit closer to the same Joy the three Magi discovered long ago.

We will take part in this tradition in church together on Epiphany Sunday (January 7th) when you'll have an opportunity to get your Star Word for 2024. As part of our worship, I have a tradition of inviting anyone who feels led to share a brief reflection on their previous word. It's usually informative and a truly meaningful opportunity to share our hard-earned wisdom with others. Even if you didn't, have an official Star Word for 2023, please consider sharing about any one of the themes and messages that were significant to you over the last 12 months.

As we enter a new year, whether through Star Words or another spiritual practice, my prayer is that we'd find guideposts and guiding lights for our journey each step of the way!

Thanks to everyone who supported the pre-Christmas sale to benefit Friends for Health in Haiti. The sale netted \$420 to help this very important mission outreach.



Adult Education

We will start up Adult Education on Sunday, January 7th following worship and coffee hour. Our first topic of the new year is "Making Disciples". In this unit, we will learn that making disciples, at its simplest, is an invitation to others to live as followers of Christ. Although Christian beliefs and practices may vary within the same faith community, disciples of Jesus gather to worship and serve God together. Making disciples is not inviting others to have an identical faith to one's own; it is an invitation to live into a faith that meets a person's spiritual needs and contributes to the goodness of the community. The six dimensions of this practice that are discussed include: live like a disciple, go, be a witness, baptize, teach and learn about Jesus, and trust in Jesus' presence always.

Matthew 28:18–20 is called "The Great Commission," and in these words we see Jesus send out his followers to make disciples, to baptize, and to teach people to obey all that Jesus taught them. He promises to be with them no matter what. Since this promise, for almost two thousand years, followers of Jesus have welcomed new disciples into Christian community and helped people come to know Christ and grow in faith.


